I firmly believe that being part of UCLM becomes a life experience.








Founded in 1985, the University of
Castilla-La Mancha is spread across
campuses within four of the provinces of
the autonomous community of Castilla-La
Mancha (Spain): Albacete, Ciudad Real,
Cuenca and Toledo. In addition, the university
is present in the cities of Talavera de la Reina
(Toledo) and Almadén (Ciudad Real).

Since its foundation as a public institution for higher education and research, our university currently offers 54 bachelor's degree programs and 57 master's degree programs, which are in accordance with the standards of the European Higher Education Area. In addition, UCLM offers a wide selection of postgraduate courses and doctoral programs. The university currently has more than 28,000 students enrolled and a team of about 2,847 professors and researchers. In addition, about 1,147 people make up the administrative and service staff. Besides teaching, research is another fundamental pillar of the UCLM, with more than 290 research groups. UCLM currently collaborates with more than 1,000 regional, national and multinational companies. This joint collaboration is mainly based on the development of research projects that are of interest to both public and private industries.

In addition, each year these companies offer internship programs for students. Currently, more than 4,000 internship programs are offered. Internationally, the university maintains an affiliation with numerous academic institutions throughout Europe, and also with various institutions of higher education around the world. This provides many opportunities to teach and study in a foreign university community. UCLM's geographical location has enabled the university to become a pioneer in the incorporation of new technologies. In addition, UCLM's commitment to excellence can be seen through its excellent reputation as one of the best universities in Spain, as it is ranked in the top fifteen Spanish universities in enrollment, R&D&I funding, and human and material resources, along with having a low dropout rate and more library space for students.

Toledo

A city with one of the richest histories in Spain. Muslims, Jews and Christians lived together in harmony here for centuries, leaving their indelible mark on Toledo's streets, monuments and buildings. Its old town was declared a World Heritage site in 1986. This center sits majestically above the Tagus River and now represents one of the most visited sites in all Spain.

UCLM has strengthened its presence its presence in Toledo at two different campuses: the Faculties settled in the city's historical quarter and in the old Weapons Factory of Toledo and in Talavera de la Reina, world-renowned for its artistic ceramics, dating back to the 16th century, recognised as Intangible Heritage of Humanity by UNESCO in 2019.

Today, Talavera de la Reina is a modern city that has become an important technological centre, being chosen by leading companies in the sector to set up their offices.

Ciudad Real

Founded by King Alfonso X in the 13th century, Ciudad Real has consolidated as one of the most important cities in La Mancha, the land of Don Quixote. It is surrounded by beautiful natural landscapes included in the list of National Parks.

The Ciudad Real Campus is located in the center of the city and is home to the Rectorate of the University.

About 100 kilometers away from Ciudad Real, in Almadén, stands the Higher Technical School of Industrial Engineering. It is the result of and also the tribute to the city's mining tradition, a mining district which includes the world's largest mercury mine, exploited in a practically continuous way since Roman times. Almadén was declared a World Heritage site in 2012.

Cuenca

A city that touches all your senses. In 1996 Cuenca was declared a World Heritage City by UNESCO, for its wonderful preservation of the original urban setting with its medieval fortress, its rich civil and religious architecture dating from the 12th to the 18th centuries and for the exceptional way the city is embraced by its beautiful natural surroundings. Cuenca is undoubtedly one of the most beautiful cities in Spain, where history, art, culture, urban and natural landscapes can all be found in one place.

The campus of Cuenca is situated on the outskirts of the city with a complex of buildings that preserves the city's historical and artistic heritage, determined by the location of a large part of its facilities in a World Heritage City, integrating advanced technologies.



Albacete

Located in the historic land of La Mancha and it is the largest city in the region. The Albacete campus can be described as a vast area covering public places and green zones, closely tied to the city's urban development and its consolidation in trade and industry. At the Albacete campus, all matters referring to university research and technology-transfer projects are coordinated.





The UCLM provides informative, personalised and support services for students with disabilities, while managing subsidies and scholarships that give students the possibility of participating in internship programmes in various companies.

UCLM Students

The UCLM offers support to its students from the pre-enrollment process to their graduation and subsequent integration into the labor market. To this end, it has several services integrated into its structure, such as the Support Service for Students with Disabilities, the centre for Information and Employment Promotion, the University Counseling Service and the Sports Services. It also manages the organization of admission exams, the processing of scholarships and grants for students and associations and the management of internships in other Spanish universities or institutions. All of this with the aim of facilitating the academic and professional development of its students.

Domestic mobility

The Spanish University centre Exchange System (SICUE) allows undergraduate students to spend part of their studies in another Spanish university. This gives them the opportunity to learn about different teaching methodologies and to enrich themselves with new social and cultural experiences in other autonomous communities.

Employment Promotion and Information centre (CIPE)

Employment Promotion (CIPE) is to support the professional development of its graduates and improve their job opportunities. To this end, it offers advice and career training, facilitates contact between companies and students, and monitors the professional development of its graduates.

In addition, it promotes entrepreneurship through the UCLMEmprende programme, which provides training and guidance so that students and graduates can assess the viability of their business ideas and develop their own business projects.

Mentoring Programme



The International Doctorate School of Castilla-La Mancha is incharge of managing, within its scope, the proper teaching andactivities of the doctoral programmes, while developing its ownstrategy linked to the research strategy of our university. Itsorganized as an Interdisciplinary School and offers eighteendoctoral programmes for the completion of a thesis, all in line withthe current legislation and positively evaluated by the nationaleducational authorities. These programmes cover the fivedisciplines: Arts and Humanities, Science, Health Sciences, Lawand Social Sciences, Engineering

and Architecture, and seven ofthese programmes are offered in collaboration with other universities in Spain.

On the one hand, it aims to encourage the specialization andinternationalization of groups and centers with a proven trackrecord in basic and experimental research, linked to thestrategic priorities of the region. On the other hand, it also seeks to promote research in the fields of humanities and socialsciences, as these are considered to be the areas of greatestimportance regarding the interdisciplinary nature of appliedresearch at our university.

Postgraduate Studies Centre (CEP)

The Postgraduate Studies Centre (CEP, for its Spanish acronym) is in charge of the organization, promotion, quality, monitoring and execution of the strategy and offer of postgraduate studies at the University of Castilla-La Mancha, guaranteeing the suitability, quality, competitiveness and internationalization of these studies in the academic and professional fields. The CEP's main function in to respond to the demand for an updated, specialized and quality lifelong learning, helping to transmit knowledge to society.

Postgraduate studies are becoming increasingly important, offering a high level of specialized training that quickly responds to the needs of the labor market and the interest of students and professionals in recycling and completing their training. These courses are taught by university professors as well as by professionals of renowned prestige.




The objective of professional specialization allows the creation of more than 100 own degrees every year. The specific degrees include the different fields of knowledge (Arts and Humanities, Sciences, Health Sciences, Social and Legal Sciences, Engineering and Architecture) and are taught on different campuses (Albacete, Ciudad Real, Cuenca and Toledo).

Language Centre (CEL)

The Language Centre (CEL) is firmly committed to promoting multilingualism, not only within the university community, but also in society in general.

The two main lines of action at CEL are language training and language certification. The CEL has a wide range of language courses through its Learn Languages Programme, including face-to-face and online courses in English, French, Italian, German, Japanese and Arabic, as well as courses in Spanish as a foreign language. In addition, the CEL regularly organises certification exams. In English, it offers the CertAcles examinations for levels B1, B2, and C1, awarded by the Association of Language Centres in Higher Education (ACLES). In French, it administers the DELF-DALF exams, with the UCLM Language Centre being the only officially recognised exam centre in the region. For international university students, the SIELE exam is also available, promoted by the Instituto Cervantes in collaboration with other prestigious institutions.

Confucius Institute at UCLM

The Confucius Institute (CI) at UCLM was established in April 2017. In accordance with the Tripartite Agreement between the Confucius Institute Headquarters (Hanban), the UCLM and Nanchang University, it is a non-profit public institution, whose objective is to promote the Chinese language and culture in the region of Castilla-La Mancha.

The functions of the CI at UCLM include teaching activities, providing support resources and services for teaching, training Chinese language teachers, and organizing official Chinese language proficiency tests such as HSK, HSKK, YCT, etc. Its presence has enabled the people of Castilla-La Mancha to gain access to Chinese language and culture. In addition, it has become a platform for cultural exchange between China and Spain, as well as serving as a bridge that strengthens friendship and cooperation between both countries.

Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL) is a learning methodology based on interaction and collaboration between two classes from two countries that develop an activity together. It is an approach that, as part of a class, connects students and teachers from different cultures to learn, discuss, and collaborate with each other. COIL becomes part of the class, allowing all students to have a meaningful cross-cultural experience within their course of study.

The overall objective of COIL is to generate an experience similar to that acquired with international interpersonal learning, but based on online interaction.

The Erasmus+ Blended Intensive Programmes (BIPs) are short programmes that combine physical mobility (5-30 days) with a compulsory virtual component, using innovative teaching methods.

- They encourage transnational and interdisciplinary cooperation, offering flexible international experiences to students, academic and administrative staff.
- They require a consortium of at least three higher education institutions from different countries and an organizing university that hosts the face-to-face phase.
- Minimum 10 incoming students per programme.
 At least 3 ECTS are recognized for UCLM students.

It aims to enrich collaborative learning and knowledge sharing through a combination of face-to-face and virtual teaching.

Erasmus+ Programme

Key Actions 1 (KA1) of the Erasmus+ programme focus on promoting the mobility of the educational community, allowing students, teaching and research staff and administrative staff of higher education institutions to carry out learning, teaching or training stays at an international level.

They are divided into:

- KA131: mobility between programme countries (EU and associated countries such as Norway).
- KA171: mobility with non-associated third countries (such as the United Kingdom or Colombia).

Both modalities seek to improve education and training through equity, lifelong learning, teacher development, strengthening European higher education and adapting to the green and digital transitions.

It is responsible for the management of Erasmus+ projects in collaboration with other universities, both national and international, which aim to promote cooperation, innovation, excellence and the internationalization of institutions. International Projects (IP) includes the projects Key Actions 2 KA2 (cooperation between organisations and institutions), Key Actions 3 KA3 (support for policy development and cooperation) and Jean Monnet Actions (dissemination of knowledge on European Union integration issues).

IP offers support to the UCLM teaching and research staff in all phases of the project cycle, from assistance and advice in the preparation of proposals to the execution and administrative and financial management.





The UCLM stands out in tourism and veterinary sciences. According to the ARWU ranking, UCLM's Veterinary Sciences are in the 151-200 range in the world, while in Tourism, UCLM is among the 101-150 best universities in the world.

The UCLM made an important commitment to research through the implementation of an ambitious Research Plan that integrates actions in terms of human resources and financing of the activity of the 290 research groups at our institution. Within the Recovery, Transformation and Resilience Plan, 18 subprojects are managed in 2024 with a total of more than 30 million euros.

The UCLM committed to improving its Human Resources policies following the European Charter for Researchers and the Code of Conduct for the recruitment of researchers. A working group was created made up of representatives of the governing bodies of the university, as well as different units and services of the UCLM, together with teaching and research staff and PIs with different levels of research experience (R1 to R4) attached to various centres and departments across all branches of knowledge to ensure maximum representativeness, analyze research contracting practices and propose improvement actions, which were reflected in the first Action Plan. The HRS4R seal was approved by the CE in January 2019 and renewed in 2021.

These actions have boosted the positioning of the UCLM in the different rankings.

The 2024 edition of the Academic Ranking of World Universities known as the 'Shanghai Ranking' places the University of Castilla-La Mancha (UCLM) in the 701-800 range of the best universities in the world. It also occupies 23th place, in the range 14-20, among the 80 or so Spanish universities. Reforms and changes in research policy over the last ten years have facilitated greater collaboration with other research institutes. With these links, research can be carried out both outside and within the university.


The UCLM is in an excellent position in the main national and international rankings that include R+D+i indicators. This is due to the support of emerging research groups, the training of our staff, and the number of grants awarded to increase the number of researchers in relevant international institutions. In addition, technical and financial advice is offered to promote the participation of the UCLM in European competitions. Finally, another key factor is the UCLM shares the development of technology with the public and private sectors.

At the UCLM, there is an intense cultural focus on all of the university campuses. The



university continuously holds exhibitions, concerts, lecture series, cinema club, and book readings. There are cultural classrooms located on the campuses to promote cultural activities and the participation of the general public.

UCLM students

The University of Castilla-La Mancha (UCLM) promotes intense cultural activity on its campuses, organising concerts, conferences, film clubs, exhibitions and workshops. Its Summer Courses, which complement academic training with the participation of national and international experts, stand out. In the field of sports, the Sports Service promotes recreational and competitive programmes, with around 7,000 participants and a presence in national and international competitions. In addition, the UCLM promotes the conciliation between studies and sport, offering collaboration scholarships. Its Volunteering Programme seeks to raise awareness and engage the university community in solidarity initiatives, including actions in rural areas to combat depopulation. The Centre for Cultural Initiatives supports cultural dissemination through workshops, meetings and events that enrich university life.

Cultural Initiatives Centre

The University of Castilla-La Mancha counts on the participation of the Centre for Cultural Initiatives to promote the cultural activities in the university world. The main aim is to spread the culture and acquire knowledge for students thought: workshops, meetings, concerts, conferences, expositions or different cultural activities.

Volunteering Programme

The Volunteering Programme of the UCLM aims to promote awareness and participation of the university community in solidarity initiatives. It seeks to promote social transformation and strengthen the relationship with regional organisations, especially in rural areas, to combat depopulation. In addition, through the European Solidarity Corps (ESC), it offers volunteering opportunities both nationally and internationally, responding to social and humanitarian challenges, and providing young people with an educational experience that contributes to a more inclusive society.

University Debate League

The UCLM organises the University Debate League on all its campuses, with 15 editions held. Its aim is to encourage dialogue and the defence of ideas in public, developing skills such as information analysis, oral expression and teamwork.

Summer Courses

The Summer Courses complement our university disciplines, offering perspectives that are not addressed during the academic year. They involve lecturers and researchers from other universities and research centres, as well as personalities from cultural, political, artistic, scientific and literary life, encouraging the exchange of knowledge, positions and ideas. This proposal is open to the whole community and is a learning complement for our students and their academic development.

University Sport

In the field of sport, the Sports Service organises recreational and competitive activities with around 7,000 participants, including the internal Rector's Trophy competition and national and international events organised by EUSA (European University Sports Association) and FISU (International UniversitySports Federation). In addition, the UCLM promotes the reconciliation between studies and sport through scholarships and specific programmes that facilitate participation in federated competitions.

José Saramago 50 Plus University Programme

On the other hand, the José Saramago 50 Plus University Programme offers training for the students over 50, with subjects in various disciplines and complementary activities such as workshops and conferences. Thanks to the support of the Regional Ministry of Social Welfare, it has been extended with the 'Get to Know Your Region' initiative.

Development Cooperation Grants

The UCLM promotes an annual call for grants for development cooperation projects in teaching, research and knowledge transfer. These projects seek to improve the training and quality of life of vulnerable communities worldwide and in Castilla-La Mancha. NGOs, foundations and non-profit organisations can benefit, as long as they have the support of a member of the university community, whether teaching staff, management staff or undergraduate, master's or doctoral students.









Heritage


